



Dear family member:

I recently underwent hereditary cancer genetic testing with Sema4 and received a positive test result. This means that I may have an increased chance to develop certain forms of cancer caused by an inherited genetic change (called a pathogenic variant or likely pathogenic variant).

These variants can be passed down in families, although not everyone who inherits a pathogenic/likely pathogenic variant develops cancer. This is true for both women and men.

I am writing this letter because it is possible that other people in our family have also inherited this pathogenic or likely pathogenic variant. Because you are my blood relative, you may want to talk to your healthcare provider about whether hereditary cancer genetic testing may be appropriate for you as there may be medical management options to either reduce the risk of developing cancer or help identify cancer(s) early. **I can provide a copy of my results, as this information will be helpful to you and your healthcare provider, especially if you decide to pursue genetic testing.**
